1. Go online to: powerschool.lpsb.org
2. Enter your username & password
 - a. Username = Your Student ID #
 - b. Password = Your Birthdate (example: August 4th, 1995 would be “841995”)
3. Select the “**Class Registration**” icon on the left of the screen.
4. To create your course requests, click on the yellow pencil icon to the right of a course group, and the courses offered for that group will appear. (Courses are grouped by core subjects and elective Career Pathways.)

a. Select the check box for each course or courses you wish to request within that particular group. Then click on "Okay". Continue for each of your core classes and electives within your career pathway.

- b. *Note: Choose enough courses to attend 8 class periods (4 per semester).*
- c. You must also choose 2 alternate courses. (Use the "Alternate Courses" group at the bottom of the registration screen to select these courses.) The system will automatically use alternate courses if a conflict exists in your 1st choice of selected courses. Alternate courses should be different courses from your 1st choice of courses already selected.

5. Hit "submit" and your schedule request will be displayed for viewing. Alternate courses are listed in alphabetical order. They are not listed in order of preference. Students can make corrections until online registration is closed. Course changes will not be accepted after course registration has been closed.

6. Once you have completed online registration:

- Print a paper copy of your final course requests entered in PowerSchool. Both the student and the legal guardian must sign & date this page!**
- The student and guardian must update, initial & date the Individual Graduation Plan (IGP) given to your student by your middle school counselor.**
- All pages (Course Requests, IGP & AP Registration if requesting AP course) MUST be returned to your middle school counselor by Thursday, February 24, 2022.**
- If you are scheduling an AP (Advanced Placement-college credit) class, you may be asked to attend a separate informational meeting to be determined at a later date.**

Failure to select courses and return documents by Thursday, February 24th will result in a schedule made for you by the counselor rather than according to your own requests.

9th Grade Advanced Placement Options

AP Computer Science Principles: Grades 09-12

AP Computer Science Principles offers a multidisciplinary approach to teaching the underlying principles of computation. The course will introduce students to the creative aspects of programming, abstractions, algorithms, large data sets, the Internet, cybersecurity concerns, and computing impacts. AP Computer Science Principles also gives students the opportunity to use current technologies to create computational artifacts for both self-expression and problem solving. Together, these aspects of the course make up a rigorous and rich curriculum that aims to broaden participation in computer science. College credit may be awarded if the student earns a score of 3 or higher on the AP Exam administered for the course.

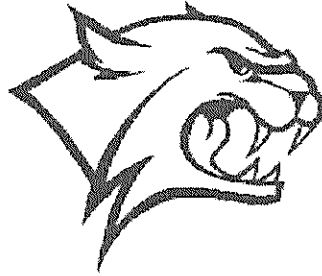
AP Human Geography: Grades 09-12

In the AP Human Geography course students will learn about the systematic study of patterns and processes that have shaped human understanding, use, and alteration of Earth's surface. Students will use spatial concepts and landscape analysis to examine human social organization and its environmental processes and effects of the human population on the planet. In addition, students will learn how to use and interpret maps, data sets, geographic models, GIS, aerial photographs, and satellite images. College credit may be awarded if the student earns a score of 3 or higher on the AP Exam administered for the course.

AP Studio Art Drawing: Grades 09-12

Prerequisite: Portfolio Submission (see teacher for details)

Requires students to complete twenty-four pieces of art. Twelve pieces will correspond to the Breadth section of their portfolio, and twelve pieces will correspond to the Concentration section of their portfolio. Students will be encouraged to make creative, well-crafted, and conceptually strong art, and understand how the contemporary art world functions. College credit may be awarded if the student earns a score of 3 or higher on the AP Portfolio for the course
