



**Glenn Ellis
Lifetime Supporter
Inducted into the
Walker High School
Athletic Hall of Fame 2018**

Glenn Ellis retired from the Livingston Parish Public School system in 1964, after serving the Walker community for 29 years as a beloved bus driver. Additionally, he volunteered for many years before and after his employment in a number of areas with the school system. He was the official clock keeper for WHS basketball games, as well as providing bus transportation to away games for both the boys' and girls' basketball teams, and fans of all ages. When the first gymnasium was built on the campus in the 1940's, it was constructed without bleachers. Mr. Ellis was instrumental in building bleachers in the gym in between his morning and afternoon bus routes. He was one of the first members of the Walker Recreation District, and the Young Men's Athletic Club initiated the Glenn Ellis Award that was first given in 1974 to the WHS senior athletes most closely representing the character that he exemplified. In 1975, the gymnasium on the new WHS campus was named in his honor.
