STEP 3: CHOOSE 2 ALTERNATE CLASSES

Select at least 2 classes from the "Alternate" category in Powerschool. Alternates will only be used if any of your first selections is not available to you for any reason. Remember that electives should be within your Career Pathway if possible. **Alternate courses should be different courses from the 1st choice of electives already selected.**

Honors (E), Dual Enrollment (DE) and Advanced Placement (AP) Course Offerings

Students are able to self-select into Honors, DE, and AP classes during the scheduling process. Requirements for admission into classes are below. Guidance will verify requirements have been met, and students will be dropped from the class if not met.

All Honors, DE, and AP courses are on a 10-point grading scale.

HONORS

- Requirements – A or B in previous class in the subject, 3.0 or higher GPA, and teacher recommendation

DUAL ENROLLMENT

- ACT score requirements for DE classes must be met by the end of the first semester. Current 9th grade students who want to take a DE class in 10th grade **MUST take the ACT by October and have a total of 12 credits by January.** That means any DE class must be scheduled in Semester 2 of the sophomore year.
- ACT score requirements: *19 Composite and 19 Math score on ACT*
- These courses are dual-enrolled through SELU, and there could be a fee for one 3 credit hour course.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

- All AP courses are one-credit year-long classes.
- LPPS awards students an extra quality point for all AP courses. Fees for AP classes are \$110 (\$55 reduced fee) for each class. **A deposit of \$55 (\$30 deposit for reduced fee) is due no later than Thursday, Feb 24th, and full payment will be required by Friday, May 6th.** Payments must be completed online. Passing an AP exam with a score of 3 or higher earns students 3 hours of college credit, with some exams having the potential for students to earn up to 9 hours of college credit.
- **It is recommended that students take no more than 2 AP courses per year.**

Scheduling Reminders

- Before choosing your courses, be sure to read all course descriptions in the Course Guide located on the Walker High School website Guidance page. It is your responsibility to be educated about the courses you choose.
- When selecting courses, please remember Walker High School's policy concerning Industry Based Certifications, Dual Enrollment, CLEP and/or Advanced Placement courses. It is our objective for every student to graduate with an IBC, a Dual Enrollment credit, CLEP credit and/or an Advanced Placement course. Please refer to the Course Guide and JumpStart Pathways chart for further details.
- **NEW Midyear Graduation Requirements You Should Know Before Your Senior Year:** Must have at least 1 of the following, 1) Advanced Credential 2) Score of 3-5 on AP Test 3) Score of 50 or higher on CLEP Test and/or 4) Dual-Enrollment credit PLUS 1) Score of 18 or higher on ACT and/or 2) Silver Level or higher on WorkKeys. Rising seniors eligible for Midyear Graduation should select 4 course requests and "Early Dismissal College" under the Early Release Seniors course group.
- All students must select enough courses to fill all 8 blocks (unless you are eligible for Midyear graduation or CO-OP). Students are not allowed to leave early.
- Students interested in Automotive off-campus courses at the Literacy and Technology Center will request the course in PowerSchool AND complete the 2022-23 online application at www.lpltc.org . Remember these courses will take 4 blocks in your schedule and you will need to provide your own transportation.
- **IF STUDENTS DO NOT COMPLETE ALL REQUIRED STEPS, COUNSELORS WILL CHOOSE CLASSES AND STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO CHANGE THE COURSES IN THE FALL UNLESS THERE IS AN ERROR.**
- When selecting your courses, consider the recommendations written on your transcript and advising checklist by your counselor. Be sure YOU are tracking your graduation and/or TOPS/Tops Tech requirements and college entry requirements. It is your responsibility! Any questions should be directed to your counselor before scheduling ends.
- Real Estate Classes are 2:30-4:30 two days a week at no credit. Must be 18 years old and Senior status. Students that choose this class may have ½ day schedule if requirements allow.

ONLINE SCHEDULING INSTRUCTIONS

Students will enter their course requests using the PowerSchool program. Please refer to our Course Guide on the Guidance Web Page (www.walkerhigh.org/guidance) for course descriptions, career pathways, graduation requirements, etc. Instructions for entering online course requests are as follows:

1. Go online to: **powerschool.lpsb.org**
2. Enter your username & password
 - a. Username = Your Student ID #
 - b. Password = Your Birthdate (example: August 4th, 1995 would be "841995")
3. Select the "**Class Registration**" icon on the left of the screen.
4. To create your course requests, click on the yellow pencil icon to the right of a course group, and the courses offered for that group will appear. (Courses are grouped by core subjects and JumpStart Career Pathways.)
 - a. Select the check box for each course or courses you wish to request within that particular group. Then click on "Okay". Continue for each of your core classes and electives within your career pathway.
 - b. *Note: Choose enough courses to attend 8 class periods (4 per semester)*
 - c. You must also choose at least 2 alternate courses. (Use the "Alternate Courses" group at the bottom of the registration screen to select these courses.) The system will automatically use alternate courses if a conflict exists in your 1st choice of selected courses. **Alternate courses should be different courses from the 1st choice of electives already selected.**
5. Hit "submit" and your schedule request will be displayed for viewing. Alternate courses are listed in alphabetical order. They are not listed in order of preference. Students can make corrections until online registration is closed.
6. **Once you have completed online registration:**
 - a. **Print a paper copy of your final course requests entered in PowerSchool. Both the student and the legal guardian must sign & date this page!**
 - b. **The student and guardian must initial & date the Individual Graduation Plan (IGP)**
 - c. **Both of these pages (Course Requests & IGP) MUST be returned to the Guidance Office by Thursday, February 24th.**
 - d. **If scheduling an AP course, turn in signed application with requests & IGP. Also, make deposit in online payments.**
